#### VENUE AND DIRECTIONS

**Venue: Whittlesford Memorial Hall**  
Mill Lane, Whittlesford  
Cambridge, CB22 4NE

Tournament Director: Paul Kemp

Whittlesford Memorial Hall is just off junction 10 of the M11. From junction 10 (Duxford) take the A505 eastbound toward Newmarket. After a mile turn left at the crossroads into Whittlesford. Mill Lane is three-quarters of a mile on the right, just before you reach a recreation ground and playing fields. The Memorial Hall is on the corner with its own car park.

If you are approaching from the east take the A11 which runs south of Cambridge, and turn off onto the A505 just after the intersection with the A1303 (the Cambridge to Haverhill Road). After two miles on the A505 you go straight over at a roundabout, and after another three-quarters of a mile turn right at the crossroads into Whittlesford. Mill Lane is three-quarters of a mile on the right, just before you reach a recreation ground and playing fields. The Memorial Hall is on the corner with its own car park.

Whittlesford is on the Cambridge to Liverpool

Street railway line, which provides a half-hourly service on Sundays. From the station walk from the west (Cambridge-bound) platform for a quarter of a mile to a cross-roads. Turn right, and the venue is just over half a mile along that road, on the corner of Mill Lane. Walking from the station should take just over 15 minutes.
